## **Non-Criminal Detoxification**

#### **A.. Legal Authority**

*ORS 426.460*

#### **B. Procedure**

1. If intoxication is the **only** offense:
  - a. Call CAHOOTS to transport intoxicated subjects to Buckley House, **or**
  - b. Take subjects to Buckley House for non-criminal detoxification.
  - c. In special circumstances, you may take the person home and release them to a responsible adult or to another approved treatment facility.
2. If they are intoxicated **and** have committed a criminal offense take them to jail.
3. Transport persons admitted to Buckley House who commit crimes there, to jail. Book them for the appropriate criminal charge(s).
4. Complete a custody report for any detoxification custody.
  - a. Report the signs of intoxication and the need for the person being taken into custody.
  - b. Try to learn where the person was drinking, when and how much alcohol was consumed, and where the alcohol and/or drugs was/were consumed.
  - c. If applicable, indicate why the person was lodged in jail.

- d. Route reports to the Oregon Liquor Commission (OLCC) when you are able to identify a licensed business that has sold to or served a person cited or arrested for DUII, MIP (Minor in Possession) or taken into custody for non-criminal detoxification.
