Fixing Eugene's Streets

Roosevelt Blvd Pavement Preservation Project

Paving of Roosevelt Blvd from Terry Street to Danebo Avenue

Project Overview

- The street is beginning to show age and loading-related deterioration. In order to prevent further deterioration and avoid more costly repairs, this street is planned to be rehabilitated by removing and replacing the top layers of asphalt pavement.
- In addition to reconstructing sidewalk access ramps at most locations, construction of sidewalk as needed to fill in gaps along the north side of the street is also planned.
- Several vegetated planters will be constructed in order to provide stormwater treatment for street runoff before entering the Roosevelt Channel.

Construction Schedule

- The City has awarded the project to Wildish Construction.
- The contractor intends to begin work the week of May 26. The project is scheduled to be complete in late July 2014.

Traffic Impacts

- Due to restrictions at the intersection of Roosevelt and Terry Street, drivers should expect full street closures during some of the work.
- Alternate access for residents will be provided, but drivers should expect detours and delays during the work.

Project Funding

- The major funding source is the Street Repair Bond passed by voters in 2012.
- Stormwater Utility Funds are funding the stormwater treatment facilities.
