



Project Information Sheet

13th Avenue from Garfield Street to Washington Street

Project Overview:

- In order to address significant deterioration of the street pavement, this street will be rehabilitated with a combination of techniques, including reconstruction of the pavement structure or by removing the top layers of asphalt pavement and repaving the street.
- Sidewalk access ramps were reconstructed at most locations.
- Additional bicyclist and pedestrian improvements were also constructed.

Construction Schedule:

- As of July 11, Polk to Washington is substantially complete. There may continue to be minor repairs and corrective work within this section that may cause short-term and isolated lane shifts or closures.
- As of September 18, the second phase, from Garfield to Polk is substantially complete. There may continue to be minor repairs and corrective work within this section that may cause short-term and isolated lane shifts or closures.

Traffic Impacts:

- The construction will be completed half the street width at a time leaving one lane open for traffic throughout the construction.
- Bicyclists should expect to merge with motor vehicle traffic depending on available lane widths during construction.
- With any construction, drivers should expect equipment and workers in the roadway leading to congestion and delays during the work.

Project Funding:

- The major funding source is the 2012 Street Bond.
