

## Active Bethel Citizens: Eugene Neighborhood Survey Results

More than 4,600 community members responded to the recent Eugene Neighborhood Survey, providing useful information about what they like in their neighborhoods and what they would like to improve. Conducted during the summer and fall of 2009, the survey was developed in partnership with neighborhood leaders and the UO's Community Planning Workshop. Neighborhood associations, as well as City staff and other community groups, distributed the survey with a special emphasis on reaching people who have not participated in neighborhood associations and underrepresented groups. These efforts paid off, as results indicate that survey responses are a good representation of the city population in terms of age, income, race/ethnicity, gender, and home ownership.

Responses for Active Bethel Citizens NA were 236, about 1.2% of the neighborhood's total population. Respondents were 31% renters, 63% homeowners and 5% owned or worked at a business. Forty-three percent of respondents' household income was less than \$30,000, 34% between \$30,000-60,000, and 23% over \$60,000. The race/ethnicity breakdown of respondents is as follows: 76.8% White, 8.9% Latino/Hispanic, 6.3% Multi-racial, 3.1% American Indian/Alaskan Native, 1.8% Asian, .4% Black/African American, and 2.7% Other. The respondent age was predominately 25-64 years old (74%), with 10% ages 17-24 and 16% age 65 or over. For planning and outreach purposes, the Active Bethel Citizens Neighborhood Analysis should be consulted to compare actual demographic make up to the demographic make-up of the survey respondents. Gaps may exist.





Fifty-five percent of respondents had not participated in their neighborhood association, but 41% expressed an interest in being connected. Survey data should be consulted for information on what would encourage respondents to be more involved and what respondents view as the neighborhood association's primary role.

Overall, Active Bethel Citizens results show that respondents generally had positive views of the quality of life in the Active Bethel Citizen neighborhood. When asked about what they would like to improve in Active Bethel Citizens, safety and traffic congestion were the most frequent responses, followed by neighborhood appearance and biking and walking.

Neighborhood surveys are considered a best practice in neighborhood planning initiatives. The survey provides a wealth of information for neighborhood associations and the City of Eugene, as we work to increase involvement and participation in neighborhood associations and improve neighborhood livability. # How long have you lived, worked or owned property in this neighborhood?






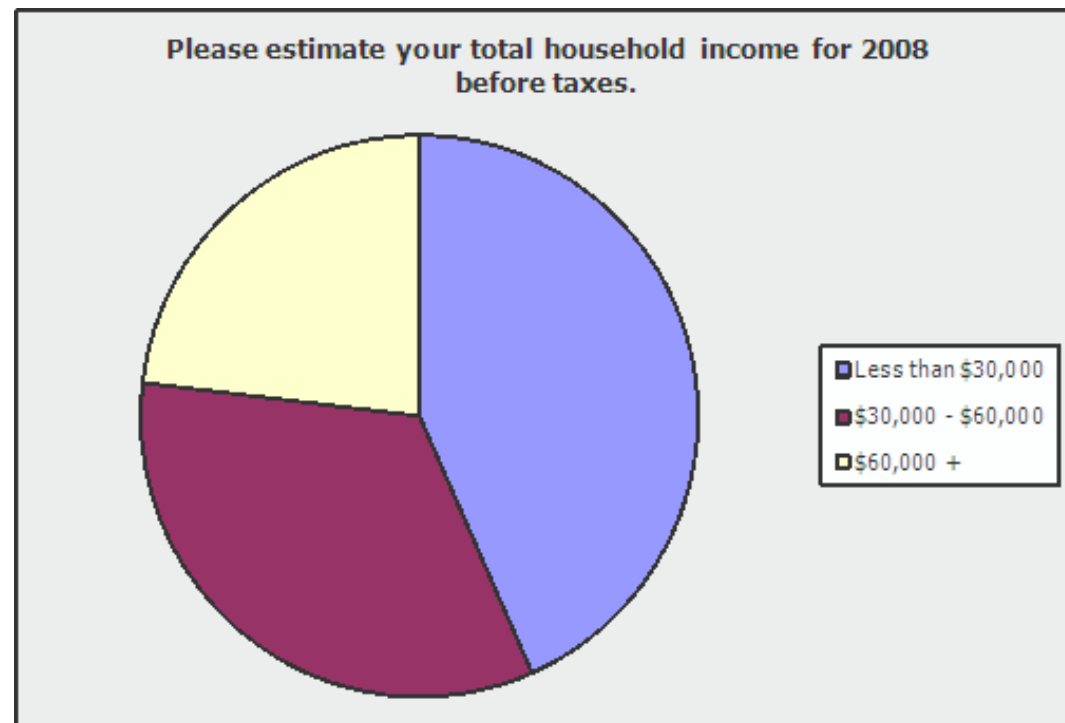

However, we need more lines (or at least busses that run more often and on weekends) and an express bus so it's easier for people to take the bus to work downtown. C. In my immediate neighborhood, no problem because I am very close to a major artery (Hwy 99). However, Barger and Royal, which I use to get to shopping, are horribly congested. One UO employee who lives out there says it takes over an hour to get to work using the bus, so naturally she drives--even with congestion it's much faster. Again: express busses (maybe with Park-n-Ride lots would alleviate this problem. Also--no more housing in the outlying areas. Some parts of the country are already bulldozing outlying housing and returning the land to agricultural use. E. &amp; F. Petersen Barn and the Echo Hollow Pool are great to have. The pool complex could use a decent workout room, though, and some rooms for aerobic excercises and classes. G. Good access to everything except good restaurants. H. Development out here has been a disaster. Almost every lot in my neighborhood has been subdivided into 2-3 lots, more than doubling traffic without any improvements even to the road surfaces. The lots are now so small most people would be hard put to grow any percentage of their own fruits, vegetables and potatoes. New housing developments and additional population in Eugene should be discouraged. With Climate Change, Peak Oil and Resource Depletion, we will need to rely more and more on local resources and residents will rely more on bikes and public transportation. Keeping population down (and population density up) will leave more farmland for growing food near the City. Older houses in the urban core (and elsewhere) could be raised and an entire new residence built underneath, making use of the same footprint while doubling the # of people living within walking/biking distance of jobs, shopping and recreational venues like the Fairground (which should stay where it is, since a) the money required to build new facilities could be better spent on other projects and services (like maybe turning the entire site into a massive community garden or public/private farming collaborative where citizens could worktrade for a portion of the harvest; b) the proposed Fairground site is ridiculously remote from the population hub; c) fewer and fewer people will be able to afford cars in future; and d) traffic/parking problems would be horrific.
