

Friendly Area Neighbors: Eugene Neighborhood Survey Results

More than 4,600 community members responded to the recent Eugene Neighborhood Survey, providing useful information about what they like in their neighborhoods and what they would like to improve. Conducted during the summer and fall of 2009, the survey was developed in partnership with neighborhood leaders and the UO's Community Planning Workshop. Neighborhood associations, as well as City staff and other community groups, distributed the survey with a special emphasis on reaching people who have not participated in neighborhood associations and underrepresented groups. These efforts paid off, as results indicate that survey responses are a good representation of the city population in terms of age, income, race/ethnicity, gender, and home ownership.

Responses for Friendly Area Neighbors NA were 334, about 4.8% of the neighborhood's total population. Respondents were 27% renters and 68% homeowners. Twenty-nine percent of respondents' household income was less than \$30,000, 34% between \$30,000-60,000, and 37% over \$60,000. The race/ethnicity breakdown of respondents is as follows: 81.8% White, 6.8% Multi-racial, 2.7% Latino/Hispanic, 2.4% Asian, 1.4% Black/African American, .7% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 4.4% other. The respondent age was predominately 25-64 years old (77%), with 14% ages 17-24 and 9% 65 or over. For planning and outreach purposes, the Friendly Neighborhood Analysis should be consulted to compare actual demographic make up to the demographic make-up of the survey respondents. Gaps may exist.





Fifty-six percent of respondents had not participated in their neighborhood association, but 38% expressed an interest in being connected. Survey data should be consulted for information on what would encourage respondents to be more involved and what respondents view as the neighborhood association's primary role.

Overall, Friendly Area Neighbors results show that respondents have generally positive views of the quality of life in the Friendly neighborhood. When asked about what they would like to improve in Friendly, biking and walking, safety and traffic congestion were the most frequent responses, followed by parks and natural areas and recreation options.

Neighborhood surveys are considered a best practice in neighborhood planning initiatives. The survey provides a wealth of information for neighborhood associations and the City of Eugene, as we work to increase involvement and participation in neighborhood associations and improve neighborhood livability. 1) As far as I know, there is no low-income housing in the whole FAN neighborhood, except for St. Vincent de Paul's small (& creepy/not safe) Lamplighter apartments, on the very edge of FAN by Amazon Parkway. As a renter, I think rents are very high in the Willamette St. area. They're driven higher because a lot of students live around Willamette, esp. the 24th & Willamette area. I can't recall seeing even one small apartment bldg. in the area between Friendly St. & Chambers--why aren't there any? College Hill provides housing for the HIGH income groups, & the housing in the suburban part for middle incomes, but where is affordable low-income housing?? Shelter is a basic need; why doesn't St. Vincent de Paul have any other developments in this large neighborhood? The parts of this neighborhood that are central and near buslines & stores are good for elderly people to live in, as well as students, but we need rentals that are affordable.

2) I dislike most of the parts of FAN particularly because of its lack of any good parks! I LOVE Amazon Park--it's got natural beauty, is easily accessible, has tons of recreation opportunities to participate in or watch, & has a community center where classes/events are held (to say nothing of the pool and Hilyard center)--and it has great places to walk--both a sidewalk and a bark chip trail.

Westmoreland Park USED to have some kind of center there, as a number of years ago I took some classes there. But it's such a disappointment these days (I do go to that park, because I have friends near there that I house sit for). It's SO small--you have to figure out extra loops and streets to walk on to get a 30 minute walk in--and there aren't enough trees (it certainly couldn't be called beautiful). The bldg. there is used for what? A boys and girls club? No community classes anymore...a big loss. No center, period, to that park. No city concerts there anymore. Worst of all, it's been taken over by disk golfers--and having walked there a number of times, I can also say it doesn't feel safe sometimes; I've seen homeless men there drinking. Disk golfers, BTW, aren't always quiet (I house sit in a park that borders on Westmoreland) & it's something of a nuisance to have to go look for their lost disks that land in your back yard. I wish the park had multiple uses and had more bark trails that wound around in different areas, with more trees, & some kind of adult center too--for classes and activities.

Washington Park, where FAN activities are held, is about the ugliest park I've ever seen! (Westmoreland is a beauty compared to Washington...at least there are trees and hills...). And where do you park? I've never tried. I think it's a shame that College Hill has such an uninspired, uninviting park. To attract ME, it needs some natural beauty especially....some place to walk too...and places for adults, not just kids. It could use a big overhaul, in my opinion, but the FAN newsletter never mentions anything to do with parks....so I'm probably a minority of one!

Monroe Park I think I've been to a long time ago, but it's very small, as I recall. Friendly Park, which I've only read about in the newsletter, I think is also very small (as I've never seen it when driving on Friendly). FAN as a whole doesn't have much in the way of green areas (see next concern), so I'd like to see the existing 2 larger parks refurbished or rethought maybe.
