- Provide guidance and input on citizen involvement in land use processes (including legislative, quasi-judicial, and planning projects) as Eugene’s Citizen Involvement Committee

We believe that working together with policy makers, public professionals, and fellow citizens in a respectful and collaborative process is essential to thriving community. Your knowledge and voice are valuable to our community, and we look forward to working with you. Thank you for your service.
