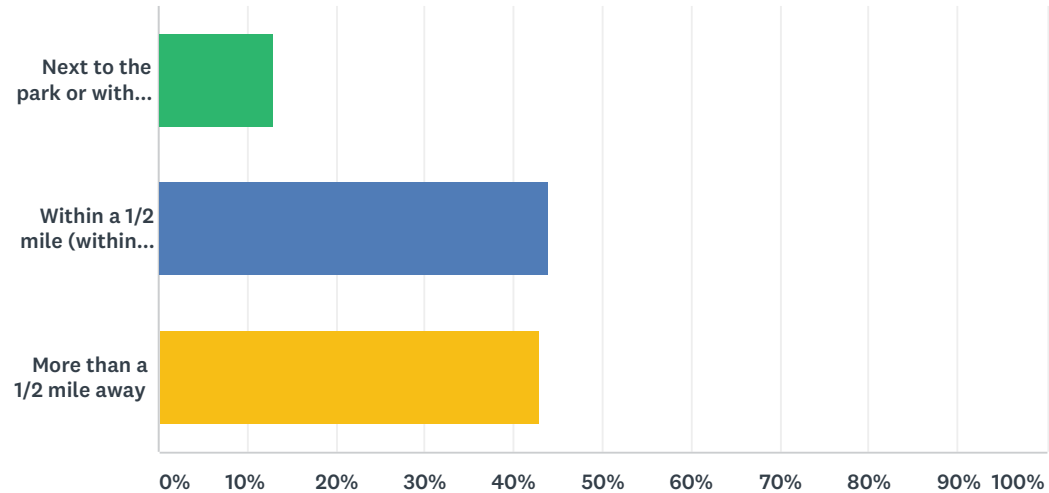


Q1 How close do you live to Scobert Gardens Park?

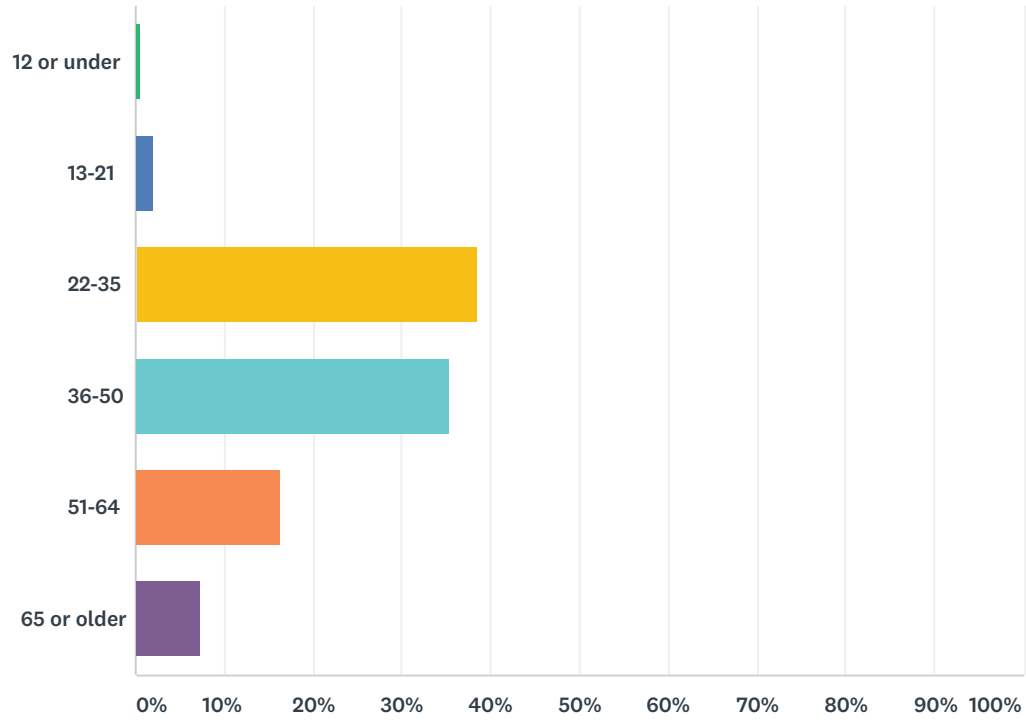

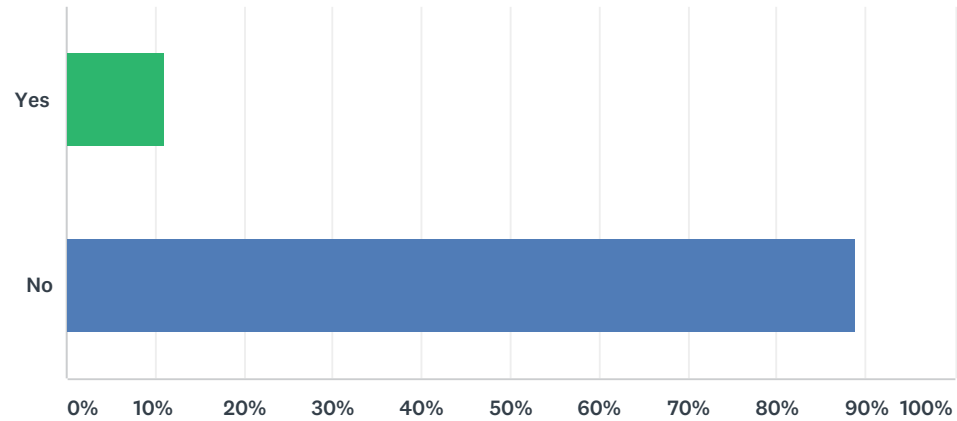

Q3 Did you attend the initial public workshop for the Scobert Gardens Park on Tuesday December 5th, 2017?

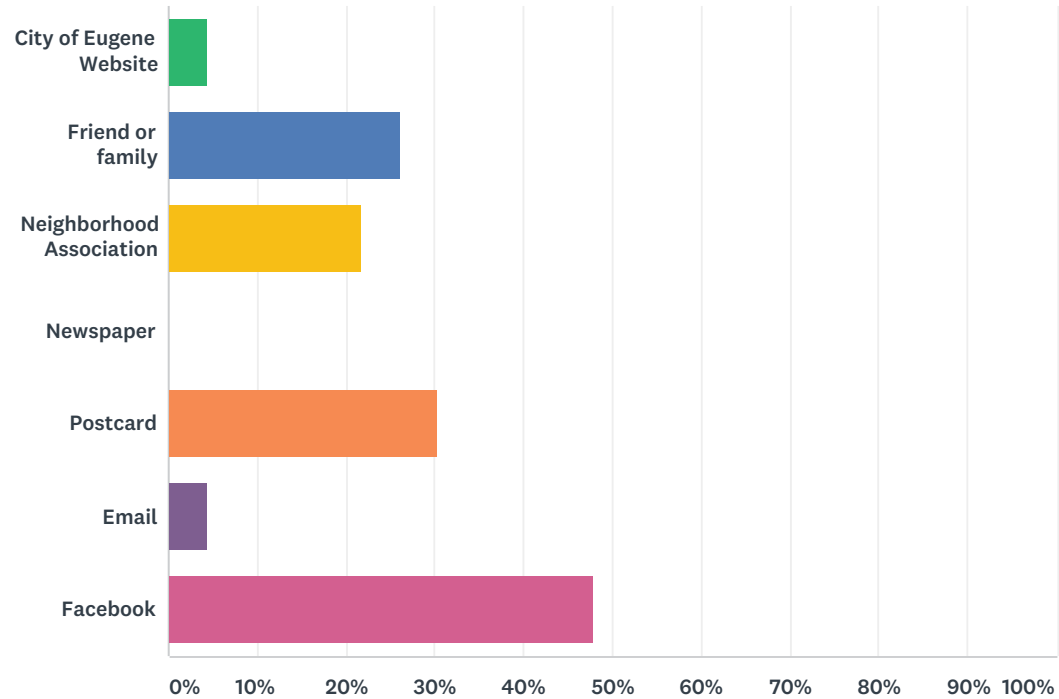

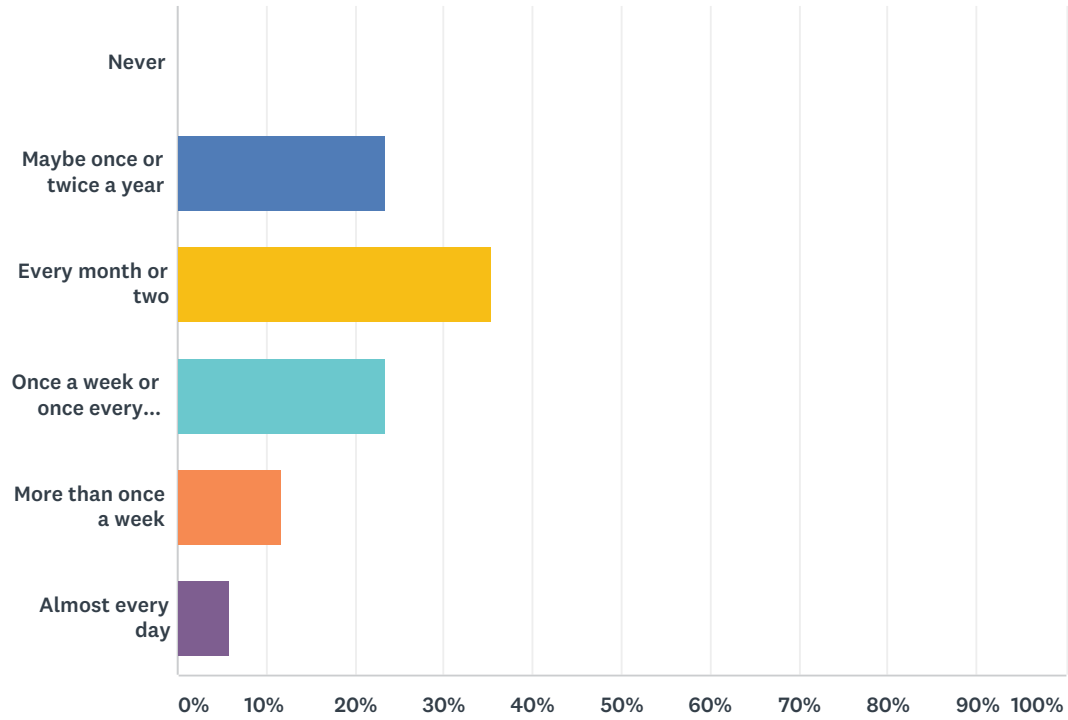
