

# Q1 Help us understand your level of engagement in this park design process for Striker Field Park thus far. Select all that apply



## Q2 Do you like the balance of irrigated lawn vs. un-irrigated areas?















Survey # 1 pretty much ignored the parking issue, except for question # 8 which asked which ammenities were a priority, off street parking was the only choice (thus that was selected-but your survey was not worded properly to get the true answer) what we wanted was a parking lot accessed from Coburg Road. Why not make it a gravel road and parking lot, this is not without precedent, for example the Owen Rose Garden uses gravel road and access, so do not tell us that this is not an option to save money. The bottom line is that the majority would rather not have a park if it does not have a parking lot and is accessed from Coburg Road. We do not want additional traffic on Grand Cayman. Survey # 2 had 160 comments made and 55 of those specifically said parking lot, coburg Road Access, Shadow View Access, and or no access via Grand Cayman. Your Surveys were so poorly worded and biased that the Crescent Meadows Home Owners had to present to the Parks Department a petition with 153 signatures clearly stating that we do not want additional traffic accessing the park via Grand Cayman, we want a parking lot accessed from Coburg Road. 
