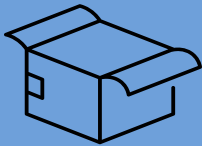


How To Comply With Tobacco Laws

Federal Laws



- Do not sell cigarettes or smokeless tobacco products in amounts smaller than the original pack size.
- Do not sell flavored cigarettes or flavored cigarette tobacco.
- Randomized FDA inspections are conducted to ensure compliance with federal tobacco laws.

State Laws

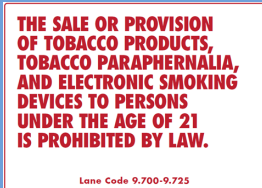


- Do not allow smoking or vaping or ashtrays inside or within 10 feet of doors, windows that open, air intake vents, and accessibility ramps.
- Post a sign that says "No Smoking or Vaping Within 10 Feet" at all doors.
- Randomized sales age inspections are conducted once a year by Oregon State Police to help ensure compliance with sales age law.
- Vape liquid containers must be child-resistant, labeled in accordance with ORS 333-015-0300 to 333-015-0375, and may not be packaged in a manner that is attractive to minors.

Local Laws



- Depending on your location, you may need to get a license before selling tobacco/vape products, and additional requirements may apply to you.
- Check government issued photo identification of everyone who appears under age 30 to confirm an age of 21 and over before making a sale.
- Do not sell tobacco/vape products or paraphernalia to anyone under age 21.
- Post Lane County sign with **red** lettering about not selling tobacco/vape products to those under age 21 at each cash register.
- Do not sell tobacco/vape products in self-service displays such as on counters or in vending machines.
- Do not provide free samples to customers.
