Are you a City of Eugene youth interested in:

- Having your voice heard in city government?
- Learning more about the Eugene community?
- Making an impact on youth in Eugene?
- Developing leadership skills?

You are invited to apply to become a member of the Eugene Youth Advisory Council (YAC)!

The YAC is a group of 20 to 25 high school age youth enrolled in grades 9-12 (or equivalent) who commit to improving their community and developing as leaders. Members will:

- Educate the general public about issues that concern Eugene's youth
- Participate in decisions regarding public issues and proposals that have an impact on youth
- Work with local government officials and community organizations to create civic engagement and service opportunities for local youth
- Advise City government on issues impacting youth and other policies the City is considering

Requirements:

- City of Eugene resident, high school age. Students who attend a Eugene high school but do not live in the city limits may also apply. Must be in 9th grade (or equivalent) in Fall of 2022.
- Willing to work and be open to learning; desire to make a positive difference for youth in Eugene and for the community as a whole.
- Previous leadership experience is not required.
- One monthly meeting of approximately 2 hours (currently the 4th Wednesday of the month from 6:00-8:00 pm), plus additional committee work outside of meetings. Applicants are invited but not required to serve as members until the end of their Senior year. Applicants are encouraged to contact staff if you see barriers to your participation or accessibility considerations so we can work to resolve these.

Application process:

- Submit the application, including a recommendation letter from an adult, to Jason Dedrick via email Jdedrick@eugene-or.gov.
- Applicants may be invited to a Zoom or phone interview.
- Members will be selected based on their potential to positively contribute to the Advisory Council's work and their capacity to represent the diversity of Eugene's youth community.
